

Almost a third more food parcels were ordered this year than last year and gift requests for children almost doubled. We are so grateful to all the volunteers and staff who packed two weeks worth of groceries for each family tirelessly into endless bags and sorted through mountains of gifts to make sure each child got something lovely. We are grateful too, to all those who donated in order to make this possible. Local companies provided large donations and thousands of tins of food. Many community groups, schools and churches also came forward with donations, as did many individuals. We even had children donating their pocket money which was incredibly moving. Every one of those people made a huge difference to other members of our community who would otherwise not have had any sort of Christmas at all. The figures were daunting. Almost 2000 mouths to feed and 925 children who, without the effort of all concerned, would not receive a gift. Together, we achieved an awesome outcome. Thank you, from all the team at The Rainbow.

Pictures, words, interpretations

During the Church Meeting on Wednesday 18 January Consultant Pastor Jim Purves invited David Stride to describe a picture that had been shared with Jim previously.

David remined us of the old analogy of coals in a fire: they may be hot underneath, but not burning properly, not bursting into life; pushing a poker into the bottom and lifting the coals introduces oxygen, and the coals burst into flame; oxygen is like the Holy Spirit, and Jim, David thought, will be used to enable us to seek the Holy Spirit.

Jim then shared how he had later been prayed for over the phone by a prayer partner, who 'saw' a stick that was hot at one end, and that stick was Jim who would be used to 'stir things up'.

Jim added that the fires are already here, the coals are here: let the oxygen of the Holy Spirit come and release the presence of Jesus!

Jim summed all this up for enews: The Lord is reviving the fire that is at the heart of Ebenezer, encouraging the glowing coals and embers to breathe in the presence and power of the Holy Spirit, igniting the flames of His presence, purposefulness and power, breathing His life into and upon this community of disciples. To the praise of His alorious name.
